Sherwood Seals Code of Conduct

The objective of Sherwood Seals is to allow a space for those with disabilities and different needs to be able to swim, enjoy and socialise in a safe and respectful environment.

The pool should be a place where everybody has fun, but the pool can also be dangerous.

So everyone can enjoy themselves, we will ask for parents and carers to support the volunteers with the members, helping them with behaviour when appropriate and ensuring that everyone is keeping themselves, and all other people, safe.

ALL MEMBERS SHOULD

- **Respect the rules of the pool to ensure their own safety and the safety of others.**
- **Think about the different needs of other members and behave in a way as to not distress others.**
- **Listen to the volunteers. They are here to help. Please don't swear at them.**
- **Recognise the differences in people. Don't pick on others for the way they look, talk or act.**
- **Enjoy yourself, but not at the expense at others. Don't fight, upset others, or take things others are playing with.**

Parents/Carers must stay at the pool for the duration of the session to help and support the volunteers with behaviour and well being
